




NB—these "hacks" are simply ways to make certain things a little easier, not revolutionize your entire life; you will still have to exercise, eat your greens, and wash occasionally.


HOUSEHOLD HACKS





Never again will you spend hours untangling the tree lights—this hack will prevent knots and makes it easier to store them away. Two for one—a holiday steal!



Having moved several times, I must confess that this next hack never crossed my mind. I'm an idiot. An idiot with a bad back. Here's how it should be done.





Sometimes I feel the need to add a tasteless novelty key ring to my keys but encounter difficulties in prying the key ring apart. Anyone else?




Arrange folded clothes within your drawers so that they are upright instead of layered on top of each other, so all items can be seen at a glance.

Where do all those earring backs, watch screws, and contact lenses go when you drop them? I'll tell you where: They're still there, it's just that you're too blind to see them.





When leaving the house for extended periods of time, I get nervous and can never remember if I've locked the door or not. This hack will save you returning home when you're halfway down the highway.





Fancy giving your impatiens a drink but can't find your watering can? The solution is only a skewer away.





This hack will prevent many a bump in the night for anxious parents whose kids seem to involuntarily fall out of bed, having been transferred from their sturdy, four-sided cot.





Crayon scribbles on the wall are the bane of any household with young children. But this way of removing them (the scribbles, not the kids) will put your mind at ease.



Are you sick of losing the remote control? I have to say that sometimes I find mine in the bathroom. If only there was a way of making sure that it stays put . .



Here's another effort-saving, iron-beating, clothes-related hack.



CAR DOOR BUMPER


Cars are expensive, especially when it comes to repairs. So, to save your hardearned cash for more important things, like beer, why not reduce the likelihood of car damage?

STAY FIZZY




When reheating your pizza, place a glass containing some water into the microwave with the pizza and the crust will not dry out. If you still want to tear away at it like a lion, that's up to you.



If you're a cheese-on-toast fan or a *croque* connoisseur, this hack takes you one step beyond.



Eggs are tricky little customers, perfectly packaged so we can't see or smell if they've gone bad until they're cracked open!





How many of us have sat down in front of the television with our conveniently microwaved leftovers only to discover that somehow the food is cold in the middle, yet piping hot around the edge?



Potatoes don't last like they did in my day . . . even the ones with fancy names. You can make them last longer with this hack.





Do you love popcorn but hate it when you end up doing permanent dental damage on an unpopped kernel? This hack will help.





Your friends are coming over and the beer isn't cold—disaster! Don't worry, a simple paper-towel hack will save you from the wrath of those beer monsters.



Dripping ice pops are the bane of many people's lives during the summer months. The drips get everywhere—on your hands, clothes, steering wheel. Here's how to stop them.


A cupcake wrapper will help you survive this sticky predicament. Just poke the wooden stick down through the middle of the cake case to create a little cup to catch the offending drips.


KITCHEN HACKS







Chopping carrots in the kitchen is good—chopping fingers is bad. You can minimize the risk of this happening with something as simple as a paper towel.


Wet a paper towel and place it under your cutting board; this will stop the board from slipping and save your precious digits. Vegetarians will thank you for not turning them into cannibals.

Keeping cleaning supplies in order is paramount for any household. The shelf I keep my products on has stuff at the back from 1998!




Drill a couple of holes in the bottom of the bin to stop the vacuum ever forming. The garbage bag will now lift out with ease.




Third-generation recipe book


DIY HACKS

Blister packs have got to be the hardest thing to get into, bar none. Even giant scissors can fail at this task. But there is a way.



Simply tie the two cords together, one cord over the other, at the connector end, before plugging it in to the wall. The more you pull, the more they stay together, and the power stays on.




THUMBSAVER-PART ONE

How to solve the age-old problem of hitting your thumb while hammering. Easy peasy—in fact, so easy that there are two solutions.


To avoid blackening your thumbs, use a clothespin to hold the nail in place before you strike it. Then you can thrash away with your hammer until the nail is firmly in place.

THUMBSAVER-PART TWO





The dust from drilling holes in walls can get everywhere. I've even found some on the cat. Here's how to make drilling dust free.



No picture hook? No problem. Here's another pull-tab hack.



Paint trays are ruined after a few uses—old paint builds up and those useful ridges just disappear. Here's how to keep your tray clean and functional.



ANTI-DRIP PAINT CAN



HEADLIGHT BRIGHTENER




BATHROOM HACKS



Bathroom cleaning products can be expensive, so why fork out when you can use everyday household items to create your own. "What?!" I hear you cry. It's true . . .





This hack is for the naturist in all of us—and will leave your bathroom smelling clean and fresh.



Many people like a drink, but washing your hair with booze is a bit over the top, even for the most radical enthusiast. However, doing this actually has health benefits, as you will see.



Become a little smarter while you shower with this little hack. (It doesn't involve waterproofing your textbooks or anything like that.)



To stop your showerhead looking like something from the Bates Motel, try this next hack.




OFFICE HACKS






KEYBOARD FEET


Now, if only you could stop yourself hitting the keyboard with your face in frustration, then we wouldn't be fixing it in the first place.

Another genius use for binder clips is to sort out all those computer cables that you are constantly interchanging, like a switchboard operator from the 1950s.






IMPORTANT DOCUMENT PROTECTOR (IDP)


You could even personalize your piece of cardboard, though I would keep it fairly corporate; Spongebob Squarepants doesn't look too professional.



"More cables?!" you cry. Well, they are an integral part of office life, so here's another wire-related hack. IT technicians, especially, will benefit from this one.



This one is for freelance artists and school teachers—technically not office jobs, but the principle still applies.





Ever lose the place where the sticky tape starts? And once you've found it, do you struggle to get it unstuck? Annoying as hell, isn't it? Read on for the solution.






PAPER CD CASE

Place an letter-sized piece of paper on your desk lengthways and position your CD at the bottom (in the center), half on, half off the paper—be careful not to scratch it at this point!






PHONE HACKS



I love tripping over the mess created around the plug when my phone needs charging! Did the sarcasm show through there?



... or even a bowl?




Both will work, but neither will look as amazing as your toilet tube docking station!

PHONE LANTERN



CHARGE BOOSTER



To preserve your charger, wrap the spring from a ballpoint pen around the wire where it meets the connector; this will strengthen the wire and make it last longer!




HACKS ON THE GO

Even the most hardened pub-goers need to get up to pee now and again, at which point your beer and seat will be left unattended. Here's a sure way to safeguard both.




Worry not. Simply put your foot through one of the straps, so if anyone does try to steal it you will be rudely awakened. Victim—1, Thief—0.



BONUS USB CHARGING POINT


Why do foreign countries insist on using oddly shaped plugs and sockets? Well, no matter—here's a hack to help all you gadget-loving vacationers.

STRAIGHT TO THE TOP




Simply tie a knot in the wire at the top near the earphone of your choice (make a mental note of which one, left or right!) and you now have a quick way to determine which side is which.

HEALTH & WELL-BEING HACKS



SOOTHE THAT BRUISE


Bruises are so unsightly and can be interpreted in all sorts of unsavory ways. Here's how to save yourself the embarrassment of having to explain them.

ZIP IT!



Are you carrying around that extra "holiday weight" from five years ago? Or just in need of a beach body? Then I have a solution.



Stress is now a common factor in the workplace, leading to many a headache. To cure your pain you need a lime—no, not for your G & T!




To give yourself a helping hand to quit, visit a sauna for three days in a row and you will sweat out the toxins, making it easier to quit.

All those long days at work (combined with late nights) can really take their toll. If you find yourself dozing off at your desk then use the following hack.



Do you want teeth white enough to blind random passersby? Then read on because this hack tastes as sweet as it sounds!



SORE THROAT SOOTHER







RANDOM HACKS




When the exam is over, you can stick the gum under the table for the next candidate to use! I went through school without ever buying any gum thanks to the generosity of others.




RE-PING YOUR PONG


If you don't have access to a lighter, putting the ball into a boiling pot of water will have the same effect. Just be careful when removing it, boiling water can be a little "burny."

Being chased by baddies is bad enough, but what if you get cramp? They'll catch you, that's what!


